I'm delighted to share with you what each year group has been up to this week.



School and Eco Councils

This year, our School and Eco Councils will meet once every half term to discuss important issues and ideas around the school. Both councils will be selected by the 27th of September after class votes. Pupils chosen to represent their peers will receive a very special badge, identifying them as key points of contact for any suggestions or concerns. Further details on their roles and upcoming meetings will be shared soon.

Nursery News

In Nursery, the pupils have been talking about their families. Through discussions, they shared photos and spoke about the unique members of their family, including beloved pets. The pupils created beautiful artwork, drawing their families and placing them behind painted doors, remembering what colour their front door is at home. Outdoors, they explored the concept of home by constructing different types of buildings and role-playing in our house area.



Reception

Reception have been hard at work learning new sounds in Phonics, focusing on 'i', 'm', 'n', and 'd'. In Maths, they have been practicing spotting the odd one out in sets and using drama to act out how the character in "Something Else" felt when faced with unkindness, enhancing both their academic and emotional learning.

This week, our pupils in RB also explored the touching story of Something Else, which teaches an important lesson about kindness and acceptance. The main character

feels isolated and different from his friends, which led to meaningful class discussions about how loneliness can make someone feel. Together, the children reflected on ways they could help someone in that situation, and their empathy really shone through.

To bring their ideas to life, the pupils used their imagination and fine motor skills to create new friends for Something Else using plasticine. This hands-on activity not only encouraged creativity but also deepened their understanding of friendship and inclusion. Now, the classroom is full of new companions for Something Else, and the children have a better sense of how to support anyone who may be feeling left out.



Year 1 - Exploring Belonging

In Year 1, the pupils began their Religion and Worldviews (REW) unit on the theme of belonging. They learned about infant baptism and had great fun roleplaying baptisms with baby dolls and water. The lesson provided an interactive and thoughtful way to reflect on the concept of community and belonging.

Year 2 – Great Fire of London

Year 2 has had a fantastic week investigating The Great Fire of London. They have been using historical sources to write diary entries from Samuel Pepys'

perspective, immersing themselves in life during 1666. In Maths, they've been learning how to use the column method to add two-digit and one-digit numbers, becoming confident mathematicians.



Year 2B – Art experience

The 2B pupils enjoyed an Art experience this week where they learnt to change a colour with tints and shades. They created a cityscape by learning about famous architects who designed buildings in London from Sir Christopher Wren to Norman Foster and Zaha Hadid. The pupils used their colour mixing skills to create an image using colour to show perspective. They understood that dark

colours look closer and lighter colour look further away and applied this to their work.

Year 3 – Flying High

Year 3 has enjoyed recounting our class book, 'Fly Eagle, Fly'. They have also loved discovering more about the human body, focusing on how muscles and bones work together to help us move. In Geography, they've been busy creating and presenting their own weather reports – a great way to build their confidence and public speaking skills.



Pupils in our 3B class have been learning all about how magnets work in Science. They were surprised to find that not all metal is magnetic, like a copper 2p coin for instance. They also learnt about how magnets function and when you have a north and south pole, they attract; however, when you have two north poles or two south poles together, they repel.



Year 4 – Teeth Investigation

Year 4 have been investigating the effects of sugar on our teeth using an experiment with eggs. Pupils observed how different liquids, such as Coca-Cola, orange juice, and coffee, change the eggshells, which represent our teeth. It has sparked some fantastic learning conversations and really brought the lesson to life!

Year 5 – Exploring Big Numbers

Our Year 5 pupils have completed their first Maths unit, exploring numbers up to 1 million and applying this knowledge in different contexts. In Geography, they've continued their study of natural resources in the UK and surrounding countries, considering how these resources impact our environment and daily lives.

Year 5B - Earth and Space Models

Year 5B have been developing their scientific modelling skills, creating moving models of the Earth's rotation and orbit around the Sun. Some groups even challenged themselves to include the Moon's orbit around Earth. It's been a wonderful opportunity for them to use advanced scientific vocabulary and collaborate on a project.

Year 6 – Persuasive Writing & World War II

In Year 6, pupils have been mastering division problems in Maths and focusing on persuasive writing techniques in English. They have been experimenting with devices like alliteration and the rule of three in their own writing. In History, they have been piecing together the events that led to World War II, putting together a timeline to understand how everything unfolded.

Art in 2B – Cityscapes with Tints and Shades

The 2B pupils enjoyed a creative Art lesson where they explored tints and shades to change colours. Inspired by famous architects, from Sir Christopher Wren to Zaha Hadid, they created cityscapes using their colour mixing skills, showing how dark and light colours affect the perspective of their artwork.


- If your child requires medication, you will need to complete a form online.
