It has been another week full of creative learning, valuable lessons, and exciting opportunities for our pupils. here are some of our highlights.



In Nursery, pupils have been learning about Anti-Bullying. They discussed the significance of wearing Odd Socks last week and created their own designs to reflect this theme. The children explored ways to be kind to their friends and considered what actions to take if someone is unkind. In EAD, they practised mixing

colours to create vibrant Traffic Light paintings, reinforcing their learning through art.

In Reception, pupils have been exploring the topic of Light and Dark. They learned about Nocturnal and Diurnal animals, discussing why some animals come out at night while others are active during the day. The children created hedgehogs, bats, parrots, and squirrels in art, all linked to their topic of exploration.





Pupils in Year1, started a new unit in English, focusing on adjectives. The pupils had fun creating menus for Fred's Cafe and engaged their senses by tasting different foods, which helped them use more descriptive language. They displayed their creativity by coming up with their own menu items and writing detailed descriptions about the food. Fred enjoyed reading their imaginative descriptions!

In Year 2, pupils became super scientists by investigating the stretchiness of different materials to determine which would be best for a gym kit.

They enjoyed conducting a fair test to ensure accurate results. The children are also looking forward to next week's experiment, where they will test whether objects float or sink based on their properties.



Year 3 had a fantastic week, particularly enjoying their computing sessions using the new Microbit programme. The pupils connected the Microbit to Chromebooks and used coding to create images, developing their digital skills in an exciting and hands-on way.

In Year 4, pupils had the fantastic opportunity to meet a local police officer who spoke about online safety. The children engaged in an excellent discussion about staying safe online and how to respond when approached by strangers on the internet. They left the session

with a deeper understanding of how

to protect themselves in the digital world.

Year 5 also welcomed a Community Police Officer who delivered a session on personal and online safety. The pupils learned important tips on how to stay safe both in everyday life and while using the internet. The session was an invaluable opportunity to build awareness and empower our pupils with essential safety knowledge.



In 4B, pupils explored the work of Victorian textile designer William Morris with our resident artist, Mrs Hatcher. They made preparatory sketches of common winter and autumn foliage and then transferred their designs to foam tiles in preparation for printing. The focus on design and craftsmanship was impressive.









Our Year 6 pupils we were thrilled to introduce the new iPads provided by Apple into the classroom. During history lessons, the pupils used the iPads to scan QR codes and research different historical figures and events. They were excited about using such advanced technology to enhance their learning, and we look forward to integrating iPads across other subjects in the near future.

In 6B, the pupils had a wonderful time using their sketching skills to create art based on endangered animals during their learning with our resident artist, Mrs Hatcher. Their artistic talents were showcased as they explored this important environmental issue through their work.
