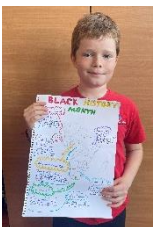
Open Days

BHM project

The projects the pupil's completed during the half term were fantastic. We enjoyed sharing them with each other in class and in our whole school assembly this week. Congratulations to everyone who participated and shared their learning with us.

Learning with our resident artists

In the last week of half term, pupils in Year 5 and 6 explored the works of Salvador Dali, a pioneer of Surrealism with our resident artists. They discussed and analysed one of Dali's most world-renowned pieces of art: The Persistence of Memory. After discovering how Dali abstractly combined various physical, real-world objects, pupils were set their own Surrealist task, in the form of a banana.



Pupils in our Nursery have enjoyed using their senses to explore pumpkins. They have thought about how the pumpkins look, feel and smell.

In RB, our pupils have been inspired by the colours and patterns of Diwali. They have been creative in all areas of learning but particularly enjoyed making Rangoli patterns. It was lovely to see pupils working together to make their creations and hear them discuss their plans for what they will do next. They have also made diva lamps, firework paintings and puppets to tell the story of Diwali.



Pupils in RW were also learning about the festival of Diwali. They compared the celebration of Diwali to celebrations such as Christmas. Pupils made their own Diva Lamps out of clay, adding details using small tools. When dry, they painted their Diva Lamps with bright colours and added glitter for an extra sparkle.

This week the pupils in Year 1 started their new History topic all about how we and our world has changed. They looked at a timeline which showed how long the world has been around before humans, how it would have looked and then changed over time. Pupils were amazed to see how short the length of time humans have been on the Earth for.



Pupils in Year 2 were ready for Halloween by end of half-term when they designed some spooky backgrounds on their ipads in ICT.

This week they launched their new Geography topic - Where do people live in the world? Pupils explored different locations using a globe as well as Google Earth. They learnt what densely populated areas and sparsely populated areas are and reflected on which part of the world we live in. I was certainly impressed with their articulation of a sparsely populated area.

This week 3B have had a brilliant week exploring the Roman invasion of Britain. They explored what the peak of the Roman empire looked like and extended their historian skills to become Roman senators to debate and decide whether Claudius should invade Britain or not. Well done, 3B.

Our Year 3 pupils have been exploring their new book 'George Speaks'. Pupils were asked to predict what might happen next in the story and used dialogue to create a conversation between the Mum and Dad. They then performed their dialogues with their partners to the rest of the class with so much confidence.

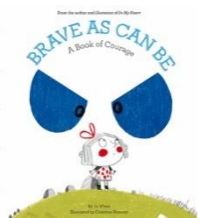


Pupils in 4B have been working very hard, especially in maths. This week they have been mastering how to subtract 4 digit numbers, from 4 digit numbers using the column method, involving renaming – this can be a tricky concept to start with. I truly enjoyed hearing them sing during their music lesson at the start of the week.

Our Year 4 pupils took part in an archaeological dig to uncover replica artefacts from the Anglo Saxon era such as brooches, coins, and necklaces. From this launch lesson, pupils are very excited about all they are going to learn in their new history topic.



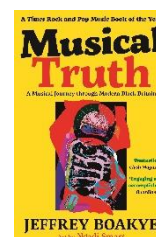
On the final day of last half term, pupils in our Year 5B had a wonderful time on their trip to the Junior Citizen Scheme. They covered topics such as Rail Safety, First Aid, Being Street Smart among many others. Their knowledge of how to be a good and safe citizen is definitely much better.



Year 5 read the book, 'Brave As Can Be' during their PSHE lesson and reflected on how we can approach our worries or doubts when we feel them. Pupils openly shared their personal experiences of overcoming challenging moments before creating brilliant 'Overcoming Worry' posters intended to help a younger person in their lives, for example siblings and younger family members.

Our Year 6 pupils have been learning about the circulatory system in Science, bringing to life how blood travels, both oxygenated and deoxygenated, round our bodies. They can't wait to look at dissecting a real heart later on in the term!

Pupils in 6B have started a new book in English called The Longest Night of Charlie Noon. They are ending the week with two great treats - a book talk by Jeffrey Boakye about influential Black musicians (based on his book called Musical Truth) and a workshop from Transport for London.
